This budding Pharmacist expressed: "My passion is to help others in need and those I can reach by sharing my knowledge and expertise to promote better health and lifestyle in my community is the reason for my chosen programme."

Like many other graduands, Younge came onto campus with many misconceptions about UG. She shared some of these with us, "One of the biggest misconceptions I had about UG [was] that UG [was] a free ride. This is not so! You have to remain vigilant and focused and remember why you chose to be there. UG made me realise that you wouldn't be handed things on a platter but you have to be passionate and driven to achieve the goals you set."

In the quest for academic success, Younge encountered severe health challenges that made her question her ability to successfully step over the finish line. She spoke: "In my last year I ended up in the hospital sick, unnoticed by many, and unsure if I would make it through to achieve a goal I set for myself and be the first person in my family to complete University with a degree. Laying on that hospital bed, I thought maybe I should quit because at that moment nothing mattered and I was exhausted mentally and physically. I was upset because it all seemed unfair just when I was coming to the end of my academic journey."

Younge added: "I coped with these challenges through my faith in Jesus Christ, praying and the prayers from loved ones while I was mentally, physically and emotionally exhausted. Also, I danced and worshipped as that was, and is a way I relieved my stress and tension."

In giving words of advice to current and prospective students, Younge urged: "Set a schedule that best suits you, find a lecturer or mentor that can provide guidance to you during your UG years, enjoy the new relationships, cherish every moment because life is short, and try not to cry after a failure, learn from it and don't let it define you. A failure is one [who] gives up after failing to get something done without trying again. UG taught me that winners don't ever quit."
