"UG changed my life, and now I will be able to help heal others" - Shineika Cort



Shineika Shadae Precious Cort - Bachelor's Degree in Pharmacy

Shineika Shadae Precious Cort, 22, recalls finding her zeal and enthusiasm for pharmacy while being engaged in her work-study stint at the St. Joseph Mercy Hospital. She was encouraged to register at the University of Guyana to read for a Degree in Pharmacy and come December 9, 2022, she will proudly graduate with a Bachelor's Degree in Pharmacy.

Ms Cort recalled: "After working with the pharmacists and pharmacy technicians, I was inspired to become a Pharmacist. I knew I would be able to become a pharmacist once I applied to the University of Guyana, and now I can say I have come to the end of this journey successfully. UG changed my life, and now I will be able to help heal others."

According to Ms Cort, one of her fond moments occurred while being a part of the Inter-Varsity Christian Fellowship Club at the Turkeyen Campus. "I remember the first day the Club transitioned to outdoors on the lawns near the Library. We truly had a grand time and it was admirable seeing students participating in the activities. It warmed my heart knowing how comfortable it felt to be able to worship in the open and share God's word with our peers," she expressed.

Though Ms Cort was striding on a strong trajectory to complete her Degree, this took a sudden downturn as her mother's health declined during her final year of studies. She said: "For months while trying to cope with the different challenges that arose from my studies, I was in and out of doctors' offices trying to figure out what was responsible for my mother's major decline in health."

Due to the severity of her mother's symptoms, her mother was unable to work. Cort expressed: "My mom was in a state you wouldn't want to see anyone you hold dear to your heart. It was bittersweet, scary and overwhelming."

Luckily, Cort's mother was able to receive the right diagnosis and the accompanying correct treatment so that her recovery has led to her being re-employed.

Cort expressed gratitude and appreciation to her friends and family members who helped her cope along the journey. In sharing words of encouragement to persons wishing to attend the University of Guyana, Cort said: "If you fall on hard times, do not give up, remember your goals and work towards them even if you have to repeat a course or take a leave of absence and return. Whatever you do, do not give up."
